He received his preparation for college by private instruction at Marbletown and at Stone Ridge, N. Y. While in college he won a number of prizes, and in particular the intercollegiate prize in Greek in the year 1878. He graduated with highest scholarship honors. After graduation, he studied at Johns Hopkins University for three years, graduating in 1881 with the degree of Ph.D., and then spent several years in study abroad, at the Universities of Leipsig and Bonn, 1881-82, and at...
